#### **Keeping Hume Clean**

Waste is always a hot topic as every household produces it, and it's all of our responsibility to ensure it's disposed of correctly and sustainably.

By now, all homes will have their new green bin specifically for food and garden waste, for collection fortniahtly. By working together to reduce what's ending up in landfill, we are saving money by avoiding costly levy fees and helping reduce emissions.

We're also making it easier for residents to get rid of their hard waste and other items that can't go in household bins. From 1 July 2024, tip passes will be phased out and replaced with flexible waste vouchers. Read more about improvements to our waste services in this edition.

### Language heroes help shape Council information

### Did you know over 50 per cent of Hume City residents speak a language other than English at home?

Our very first Multicultural Communications Advisory Group (MCAG) is made up of 11 language leaders who represent our Arabic, Assyrian, Farsi, Greek, Italian, Mandarin, Nepali, Punjabi, Turkish, Urdu and Vietnamese speaking communities. These languages cover 80 per cent of Hume's adult overseas-born population with low to no English proficiency.

Together, our goal is to ensure our communications are meeting the needs of every Hume resident.

Major Council campaigns, including Hume Highlight, are just some of the things our language leaders have reviewed before we go live.

Recently, the MCAG offered invaluable advice on the rollout of our food and garden bins (learn more about that on the next page). This new initiative reached a significant portion of our community, making it crucial to have information accessible to evervone.

A significant outcome from the MCAG's feedback was the addition of more visual aids, which now feature more prominently on all new green bins and kitchen caddies. These visual aids cross the boundaries of language and provide an easy understanding of what can and cannot be placed in a green bin, as well as outlining when residents can start using them.

The MCAG also reviewed the first two editions of this magazine to let us know what their language groups and communities would benefit from reading about. As a result of the group's input, readers can now read this magazine's News in your language section in our top 11 languages! We're looking forward to improving the information we share here and in future editions moving forward.

Our language leaders' feedback has made News in your language more accessible.

### Get to know your green bin

Whether you're new to the food and garden bin or have been using one for years, here's everything you need to know.

It's been 10 years since we first introduced the food and garden bin (or green bin). Since then, nearly half of the households in Hume have started using it.

We are now making it part of our standard household bin collection service. We have finished delivering over 42,000 green-lidded bins to fill in the gaps. Everyone in Hume will have three bins - garbage, recycling and the green bin.

#### Why do we need a green bin?

The biggest benefit of using the green bin is protecting the environment.

By weight, food waste makes up half the contents of the average garbage bin in Hume. In landfills, organic material breaks down and creates harmful greenhouse gases like methane that contribute to climate change.

Everything in the green bin, however, goes to a local facility to be recycled into compost. So, when you put food and garden waste in the green bin, you're not just keeping bad stuff out of landfills, you're turning it into a valuable resource!







#### What to put in (and what to leave out!)

You can put any kind of food in the green bin, including meat and bones, cheese, eggshells, sweets and processed foods. It doesn't matter if it's raw or cooked. Make sure you remove any packaging first, especially fruit stickers and rubber bands (put these in your garbage bin).

Garden waste is any plant material from your garden. This includes cuttings, weeds, leaves, grass, vines, sticks and small branches. You can even put wilted flowers in - just remove any string or other packaging.

Items you can't put in the green bin include tea bags, pet poo, kitty litter, rocks, soil and timber (no icy pole sticks or wooden cutlery). It's also important not to put any plastic in the green bin because it will spoil the compost - that means no caddy liners!





Looking after your green bin and kitchen caddy will help prevent bad smells and pests. Here are some things you can try:

- sprinkle bicarb soda on top of food scraps
- keep them in the fridge or freezer until bin night
- wrap them in a small amount of paper towel or newspaper
- cover food scraps with garden clippings in the bin

Let hot food cool down before putting it in your caddy or bin, and keep your bin out of direct sunlight with the lid closed.

You should also empty and wash your caddy every few days (it's dishwasher-friendly!) and rinse your green bin with a hose as needed. If it gets really dirty, scrub it with dishwashing liquid and a broom.



It's also a good idea to put your green bin out every fortnight, even if it's not full. That way you won't have old food waste building up on the bottom of the bin.

#### You're ready to roll

That's everything you need to know to put your best wheel forward when it comes to your green bin. If there's anything you're not sure about, check our website or get in touch!

الغرض من الحاوية الخضراء هو المساعدة في إزالة مخلفات الطعام والحدائق من مكب النفايات. تشكل مخلفات الطعام نصف محتويات الحاوية الحمراء بالنسبة للوزن. تتحلل المواد العضوية في مكبات النفايات وتخلق غازات دفيئة ضارة مثل الميثان التي تساهم في تغير المناخ. ومع ذلك، فإن كل شيء في الحاوية الخضراء يذهب ِ إلى منشأة محلية لإعادة تدويره إلى سماد!

Yeşil çöp kutusunun amacı gıda ve bahçe atıklarının cöp sahasından uzaklaştırılmasına yardımcı olmaktır. Ağırlık olarak gıda, kırmızı çöp içeriğinin yarısını oluşturmaktadır. 



### **Capital works update**

We officially opened the multi-million dollar State **Rugby League and Community** Centre at Seabrook Reserve in Broadmeadows in Mav.

With Broadmeadows now the home of the Melbourne Storm Women's team, as well as the new headquarters for NRL Victoria, this is a huge milestone for rugby in Victoria, as well as for voung aspiring athletes within Hume.

The \$22 million project was jointly funded by Hume City Council and supported by a \$14.3 million contribution from the Victorian Government, alongside additional investment from NRL Victoria and Melbourne Storm. This funding will help support facilities for the growth of rugby league in Victoria, particularly for women and girls.

In 2023, we opened the play space at Seabrook Reserve and are excited that the new community hub is now open and available for hire for both small or large events. It includes community rooms, meeting rooms, kitchen and amenities. catering for up to 80 people.

Hume City Council is delivering on projects that will continue making Hume a great place to live, play and visit, thanks to a record \$558 million four-year capital works program.



Seabrook Reserve has just undergone a major \$22 million upgrade, completed in May this year. ### Information you need to know about October's Local Government Election

Local Government elections will be held on Saturday 26 October. As they approach, it's important you are informed and prepared.





#### **Election date**

Victorian council elections will be held on Saturday 26 October 2024. This is your opportunity to have a say on who represents Hume Citv.

In the lead up to elections, Councils must ensure they do not publish or distribute any information which could affect election voting. This time, from 12pm Tuesday 17 September - 6pm Saturday 26 October, is known as the caretaker period. We will only be communicating essential news during this time.

#### How to vote

The election will be by postal ballot, and ballot papers will be automatically sent to your address by the Victorian Electoral Commission (VEC). Here's what vou need to do:

Keep an eye on your mailbox. Ballot packs will be delivered between Tuesday 8 October and Thursday 10 October.

Complete and post your ballot by 6pm on Friday 25 October.

#### Vote counting and results

Vote counting will begin on Saturday 26 October, and all election results will be declared by Friday 15 November. Stay tuned for the announcement of new council members.

#### Ensure you're enrolled

To participate in the election, you must be enrolled to vote. Please check your enrolment details at vec.vic.gov.au/enrolment/checkmy-enrolment and make sure your postal address is correct.

When you check your enrolment, you will be able to view the new electoral structures and ward boundaries for this year's election.

#### **Changes to Wards**

In February 2024, the Victorian Local Government Minister announced changes to the electoral structure of Hume City Council. As part of this, Hume City Council will transition to having 11 wards, each represented by one Councillor.

The new wards are Aitken, Bababi Marning, Burt-kur-min, Emu Creek, Jacksons Hill, Merlynston Creek, Mount Ridley, Roxburgh Park, Tullamarine, Woodlands, and Yubup.

### Beat the chill this winter



### Keeping your home warm this winter


The colder months have arrived, and with that is unpredictable Melbourne weather. It can be difficult to keep ourselves and our homes warm during winter. Here are some easy solutions to keeping the cold out of your home!

- Use door snakes, rolled up towels or self-adhesive rubber seals to block out draughts from doors and windows that might be letting warm air escape.
- Use heavy, lined curtains that fall below the window to keep warmth in.
- Not sure where to start? Hume Libraries Library of Things includes a collection of useful items that can help, including their thermal imaging camera that helps identify areas around the home where you might be losing heat.

### Winter-proof your garden for the colder months


- Remove any dead plants, leaves or debris that have gathered. This helps to reduce the risk of diseases and pests in your garden.

- Water garden beds well before they become frosted to make sure it is well hydrated throughout the colder months.
- Apply a layer of mulch like straw, leaves, or a light bark, to help protect your garden from weeds, changes in temperature and soil erosion.
