Cr Kurt updated Council on his attendance at the second meeting of the Broadmeadows Revitalization Board, held on 3 October 2017.

The meeting was attended by Richard Bolt, Secretary of the Department of Economic Development, Jobs, Transport and Resources and Fiona Williams from the Housing sector of the Department of Health and Human Services, who has replaced Mr Zubair Bhura of TNT Australia as a Board Member.

Cr Kurt advised Council that the Board is currently working on presenting an official communique to the Minister for Suburban Development the Hon Lily D'Ambrosio and the Minister for Industry and Employment, the Hon Wade Noonan. A high level summary of the Board's priorities will be presented to Board members at the next meeting, with an aim to have a full report which will include opportunities and priorities to support the Broadmeadows region to be completed by December.
