Irrigating is expensive and often just not possible, depending on the availability of water.

During the colder, wetter months, with a porous surface system that allows rainwater to drain away quickly in wet weather, these synthetic turfs are safer and allow for activities to continue.

Participation in the world game is increasing in Hume City and by 2041, world football will be the secondmost participated-in sport in Hume.

As a result, investment is needed to ensure we deliver facilities that meet the needs of our rapidly growing communities and help encourage additional participation to get more people active and engaged in their community.
