Vista Park Playspace Upgrade in Sunbury

Bringing new sporting opportunities to Hume

What is the project?

Vista Park is a neighbourhood park with a primary function of social recreation. The park is designated Public Park and Recreation Zone and there are no planning overlays.

This project was identified as a part of the Outdoor Space Strategy, with an opportunity to optimise the space and improve amenities.

The project aims to improve health and wellbeing needs of the local community, by upgrading the playspace area and creating a new concrete path, more shade trees adjacent to the playspace and seats with arms to encourage grandparents or carers seeking to spend more time outdoors with children.

The planned upgrades will include:

- Playspace renewal
- New Half Basketball court
- New Drinking fountain
- Tree planting and garden beds
- New furniture
- Path works upgrades
- New shelter

Why is it important to the Hume City community?

The provision of quality local park infrastructure including a play space and associated social and active infrastructure to Vista Park Reserve, will provide the immediate community the opportunity to play, be physically active, socialise and connect with neighbours when there previously wasn't an enticing opportunity to do so.

The appeal of having infrastructure that supports physical and mental well-being, which is easily accessible both in its location and physical connection is much more enticing for residents than driving to a park with amenities.

The upgrade to the reserve intends to strengthen the connection to residents in both Goonawarra and Rolling Meadows as well. By better connecting to its shared path, it will diversify the activity provision of the reserve but also invite broader community members to venture to the new improved reserve.
