

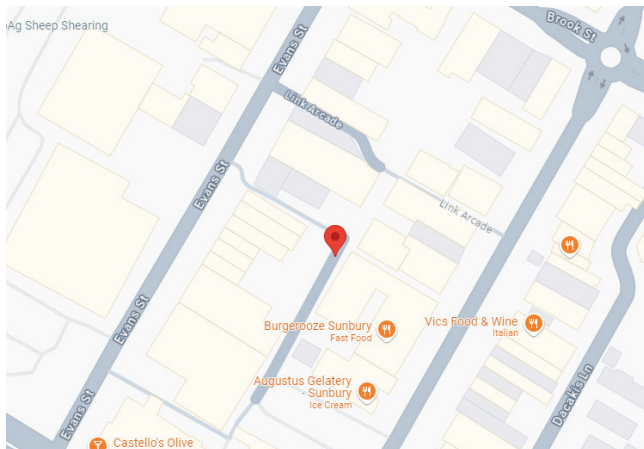
Saleyard Laneway Streetscape (Sunbury)

What is the project?

In the last 10 years the Sunbury Town Centre has undergone a significant makeover with replacement of the old brick, uneven and slightly dangerous pathway with new streetscape which is providing safer access for the community, increasing community pride and supporting greater economic activity.

The Saleyard Lane Streetscape project aims to enhance the laneway in Sunbury Town Centre, improving both functionality and aesthetics for the community. This initiative will upgrade the paving and lighting to ensure safety and accessibility for pedestrians.

The project includes enhancements to pedestrian crossings and introduces greenery and seating, transforming the laneway into a vibrant space that encourages social interaction. By revitalizing this key pathway, the project seeks to foster community connections and make Sunbury Town Centre more inviting.



Why is it important to the Hume City community?

Having a vibrant and attractive town centre is critical in supporting the local economy. If a town centre is unsightly and discourages people from exploring all that it has to offer, then the wider community will suffer through lack of economic activity which hits local businesses hard and has a flow on effect to those employed.

The Saleyard Lane project is important to Hume City as it enhances the urban environment and encourages foot traffic, benefiting local businesses.
