#### 7. PUBLIC QUESTION TIME

#### PQ1233 PUBLIC QUESTION - KEVIN BALAAM

Were these paths intended as a replacement for the bike lane on Hume Highway that was removed for the train maintenance and stabling facility's road entrance, or what other measures have been taken in the last ten to fifteen years to compensate for the loss of the Hume Highway bike lane?

#### **RESPONSE: DIRECTOR CITY PLANNING AND PLACES**

Council acknowledges the need for improved cycling connections across the municipality, including around the Hume Highway corridor. While the Hume Highway is managed by VicRoads and the bike lane is a state government matter, the projects mentioned above are part of Council's efforts to improve off-road bicycle connections. Council's Transport Strategy, adopted in 2024, prioritises the creation of low-stress cycling links to make cycling a more inviting and safe option and we look forward to the implementation of this strategy bringing forward more off-road cycling links.

As part of the endorsed Transport Strategy, Council will also be developing precinct-based Transport Plans that will provide opportunities for missing links in the cycling network to be highlighted and prioritised.

Council is seeking partnerships with State Government to continue improving connectivity in open space in this area. Council's Draft Open Space Strategy, placed on community engagement earlier in 2024, also includes actions for Council to partner with the Victorian Government to secure land near the Hume Highway to support creek restoration and connectivity. It also commits to partnering with Yarra Valley Water to provide north-south shared path connection along Amaroo-Lockerbie Pipe Track from Craigieburn Station northward to Merri Creek. The final Open Space Strategy will come to Council for adoption during 2025.

#### PQ1234 PUBLIC QUESTION - KEVIN BALAAM

Can the Council provide any updates on the extension of the Merri Creek Trail from the M80 Ring Road Trail north, passing through the old Pipeworks site and the Park4MX motocross park, to connect with the existing section of the Merri Creek Trail within the Bolinda Road Landfill site and Galada Tamboore Parklands?

# **RESPONSE: DIRECTOR CITY PLANNING AND PLACES**

The extension of the Merri Creek Trail from the M80 Ring Road into the Galada Tamboore parklands is a priority project for Council. This is confirmed in the Draft Open Space Strategy 2024 and the endorsed marram baba Merri Creek Parklands Plan 2023.

There are two parcels of land are required for the delivery of trail connection:

- The southern parcel closest to the M80 (old Pipeworks site) has a permit to develop the site. This permit has planning conditions to transfer the creekside land from their development to Council. This is required to happen prior to occupancy which is expected in 2025.
- The second parcel is owned by Council but is currently leased, however is up for renewal. Council is in discussions with the motocross operator for the return of part of the lease area to deliver the Merri Creek trail. This aligns with the special conditions of the lease. Once access to the full path is secured, we can commence investigation.

Council's marram baba Merri Creek Regional Park program will aim to commence investigations for the trail creation in 2025/26 financial year. This includes ecological, cultural heritage, and land contamination investigations that will inform the design and construction in the following years which is aimed for 2026/27 subject to findings.
